ADVANCED PLACEMENT EXAMINATIONS

- In the 2017-2018 school year, 292 Charlotte Catholic students, grades 11-12, took 847 AP exams in 16 subjects.
- 88% of the AP scores were 3 or above.
- AP examinations are mandatory in each AP course.
- Students are afforded AP classes beginning in the junior year.
- Admission to AP courses is competitive. PSAT scores, grades in prerequisite courses and an application work product are required.

THE CHARLOTTE CATHOLIC HERITAGE

Charlotte Catholic High School is a coeducational, parochial, college preparatory high school of 1,200 students, grades 9-12. Charlotte Catholic is an outgrowth of an educational program which began in 1887 at St. Mary's Seminary, in what is now uptown Charlotte.

Charlotte Catholic has been an integral part of the Charlotte community since 1955 and moved to its new campus in 1995. Although the majority of our students share the Catholic faith, qualified students are admitted without regard to race, creed, sex or national origin.

COLLEGE MATRICULATION CLASSES OF 2016-2018

In the past three years, CCHS graduates have matriculated to **156** different colleges and universities. **75%** of graduates enrolled in public universities and **25%** of graduates enrolled in private universities. **55%** elected to remain in North Carolina while **45%** chose institutions in other states. **97%** chose four year colleges while **3%** chose two year colleges.

ATHLETICS

Since 2000, Charlotte Catholic High School has won 53 state championships and has been state runner-up 55 times. During that same time, Charlotte Catholic was named recipient of 8 Wachovia/Wells Fargo Cups recognizing the top athletic program, by division, in the State. CCHS is one of three parochial schools competing in the North Carolina High School Athletic Association. We currently participate in Division 3A. Many of our student-athletes continue to participate in the NCAA.

FINE ARTS

The Charlotte Catholic Visual and Performing Arts Department works closely with students to achieve a high level of performance in music, dance, theatre, art, and photography. Students in the Visual Arts are consistently awarded Gold and Silver Keys in the Mid-Carolina Scholastic Awards, with many receiving Honorable Mentions. The theatre program produces a Fall play and works closely with the music and dance programs for our annual Spring musical. The band program has performed for nationally televised events and quadrennially performs in the St. Patrick's Day Parade in Dublin, Ireland.
